





Chapter Case Lot Sale Fundraiser a Story of Challenges

Chapter 751 once again took advantage of the commissary's May 23-25 case lot sale to operate a food concession stand. Things however did not go as planned but AFSA volunteers proved that flexibility is the key to burning burgers.

Ominous signs of things to come appeared when the commissary changed the weekend to hold the case lot sale to the Memorial Day weekend. In fact, the chapter wasn't informed of the change and learned about it through the base newspaper. By then, many volunteers had already signed up to work the original weekend. The change in weekend forced some volunteers to drop out of the event, but others rallied to the cause and filled the six shifts.

The next setback was the placement of the case lot sale. The commissary put the sale items and the chapter concession stand next to the base theatre instead of in front of the commissary. That meant the chapter would only get case lot sale shoppers and miss out on potential customers just there to shop in the BX or commissary.

The new location proved to be challenging for both the chapter and the commissary. Electrical power was a logistical hurdle that was going to be addressed with the chapter's generator. However, mechanical failure of the

generator forced the Chapter to plan D. (or was it plan E by now?) Another generator was "acquired" and the concession stand became fully functional to the delight of the hungry.

And then the rain came!

Despite the rocky start to the weekend, the chapter managed to raise \$812 with 10% earmarked for the Fisher House Capital Fund and another 10% to Chapter A751, our great auxiliary.

Hopefully we'll have fewer challenges when we do this again in September.

Legislation: Montgomery G.I. Bill Overhaul

The Montgomery G.I. Bill was a great recruiting tool when it was enacted. Unfortunately, academic programs and associated costs have changed while the MGIB has become outdated.

Active Duty, Guard and Reserve members all continue "normal" worldwide missions in addition to supporting the war effort. However, the 10-year time clock to use MGIB benefits for the Guard and Reserve starts when they enlist. The Active Duty clock stops 10 years after retirement or separation. Both severely restrict use of an earned educational benefit.


Another inequity exists with for those who

were encouraged to decline the Veterans Educational Assistance Program. Over 40,000 military members were affected and many retire(d) with no educational benefits at all.

AFSA also believes MGIB benefits should be transferable to family members.

Senate Bill 22 proposes some changes to the MGIB for post 9/11 military members. Watch for upcoming bill amendments that offers improvements for more members. Go to <http://thomas.loc.gov> and look up SB 22. Get informed and tell your elected official to support the amendments!

All American Evening an All Around Success!



Why Do I Need To Be Part Of AFSA?

I hope you consider AFSA your professional organization of choice; joining the fight for improved compensation, benefits and quality of life for all Airmen, past and present. Whether you are a new member, an established member approaching renewal time, or talking with your fellow Airmen about the importance of AFSA, I ask you consider the following points:

- In 2007, the administration proposed a 2.1% annual pay raise; AFSA fought for a 3.1% pay raise and won.
- AFSA is fighting for increases in BHA due to rising out-of-pocket costs
- While DoD plans to establish a TRICARE Standard enrollment fee and significantly increase annual deductible payments, AFSA is fighting to reduce TRICARE costs and preserve the decades-old promise of lifetime healthcare.
- The current Montgomery GI Bill fails to cover the full costs of a four-year

education nor does it allow for enrollment at anytime during an Airman's enlistment. AFSA is fighting to increase educational benefits (see article on page 5)

- While DoD and DECA are trying to alter pricing policies and reduce commissary benefits, AFSA is fighting to maintain your current commissary benefit.
- AFSA does not believe Reserve Airmen should have to wait until age 60 to receive retirement benefits, much less that increasing the age to 62 is acceptable; and AFSA is battling hard to reduce the retirement benefit eligibility age to 55.

These are but a few reasons to become and remain an AFSA member. The association can only be as successful as it has been with your support. 



What am I trying to say? It is really simple: if we believe in something, are we not willing to stand up for it no matter what the cost...even if no one else sees the value in it?


